Location

- **The Old School House is conveniently placed on the main road,
within walking distance of all of the village amenities, e.g. post
office shops, pub, village hall.**

**The Bus stops almost at the door and there is a train service from Hull
stopping at Gilberdyke and Goole.**

The home itself

The home is all ground floor (no steps stairs or lifts) it is divided into three small units, two are purpose built.

One unit, the whole of the interior is purpose designed

- Extra wide corridors and all the facilities for the disabled such as large bathrooms with a variety of hoists and wet rooms.

- ***The homes facilities:***

- **The Courtyard**

- 13 single rooms including 4 with en-suites
 - 1 companion room
 - 2 lounges
 - contained central courtyard
 - Certain external doors have alarmed doors and key pads
 - Specialised bathrooms & toilets

- **The Bungalow**

- A facility for those who have retained some mobility and independence and wish to receive personal care within an environment that enables them to live in an environment with some independence

- 5 single en suite bedrooms some with patio doors to the garden
 - 3 single bedrooms one with patio doors to the garden
 - lounge and dining room
 - A service users kitchen for those who wish to make their own drinks and snacks

- **The Old School House**

- 10 single en suite bedrooms
 - 1 single bedrooms
 - 2 companion bedroom
 - 2 lounges and dining room
 - Each unit has a range of bathrooms, toilets and domestic facilities.
 - The home has a loop for those with hearing difficulties

Laundry

The home has an en site laundry
Dirty laundry is taken from the room daily and usually returned
washed and pressed within 36hrs
All clothing must be machine washable & tumble dry able and have
sewn on name tags

Lifestyle

- Entertainment and activities are offered, participation is purely optional
- A residents committee meets at least once a month to discuss the various running and routines of the home including menus, and activities
 - We are a non-smoking home
- Telephones can be installed in your room alternatively a mobile phone is available in the quiet room
 - Clergy, GP's and hairdressers visit the home on request
- Chiropodists, physiotherapists, opticians, district nurses can also visit via the GP and subject to an assessment of need

Staffing

- The home is run by a care manager who is also a registered nurse
- In her absence the home is managed by a range of qualified nurses, and care staff many have NVQ 2 and 3 qualifications
 - All new staff receive an induction to TOPPS specification and throughout the year attend foundation training

Diet

- Meals and refreshments can be taken in your own room
 - Including breakfast
- There is no pressure to get up or go to bed the choice is yours
 - Food is prepared on the premises and there is a choice at all meal times
 - Tea making in your own room can be facilitated subject to a valid assessment of risk

The homes aims and philosophy

We aim to offer our service users the opportunity to enhance their quality of life

- **To maintain their activities of daily living skills**
- **To maintain their intellectual and social capacities**

We aim to protect the service users rights to:

- **Choice, dignity, privacy, civil rights, fulfillment, religious and cultural beliefs,**
- **freedom from all kinds of abuse, have a range of options open to them**
 - **Calculated risk taking**

Introduction to the home

- **All prospective service users are assessed prior to admission by a qualified person to ensure the home can meet their needs**

This can best be facilitated by:
- **The prospective service user visiting the home for a cup of tea or stay for a meal**
- **A representative of the home visit you at home or in hospital**
- **The first month of your stay is temporary binding on both parties**
- **Subject to vacancies the home also offers, short stay, holidays and respite care**

The care

A comprehensive assessment of your care needs will be made with yours and your representatives participation
This assessment forms your plan of care. The plan will be reviewed each month or as your care needs change
